Dear Parent/Carer

Hello and welcome to the sixth issue of the QE Transfer Weekly Update.

You will have seen in the press this week that the government has now released the guidance for schools reopening in September. What's your name and what is your role in school?

How long have you been at QE and where have you taught before?

I have been at QE since September 2001, I joined as a NQT and have held various positions including Head of Faculty, Head of House/Year. I completed my teacher training at the Kennet School in Thatcham and Bath College.

What do you teach and why did you decide to go into this subject?

I teach Business and Economics. I love the subject as there are so many real life examples to draw from.

Why did you come into teaching?

Before I came into teaching, I worked for BMW Group as a purchasing manager. As part of my role I led workshops with visiting schools to the factory. When the government in 2000 offered training bursaries for new teachers, it was an opportunity to pursue this as a career.

Uniform Students must be in their Middle School uniform.

Arrival The day starts at 9.00am, students will need to be dropped off at the QE Leisure Centre car park between 8.45 and 9.00am. **Please do not use the front of school.** Drivers should follow signs carefully to ensure that students can be dropped off safely. If students are cycling to school there will be bike racks allocated for them to use. If they are walking please use the QE Leisure Centre path and entrance.

When students arrive they will need to make their way to the QE Leisure Centre tennis courts, they will be directed to this location by the Senior Leadership Team and Heads of House. They will be met by their Tutor who will have a sign indicating their Tutor group. The tennis court will be set up to enable social distancing. Sanitiser stations will be available. Students must maintain social distancing at all times.

Their Tutors will escort them to E Building and the designated room for the morning. This will be done one tutor group at a time. On entry into the classrooms students must use the hand sanitising resources available.

Tutor Sessions During the time in the room the students will have the opportunity to go through some housekeeping and rules for the morning, including the location of toilets and social distancing rules.

There will be a virtual Assembly led by Mrs Boyes, the Senior Leadership Team and the Heads of House.

The Heads of House address will welcome students to QE and go through our expectations. There will be an opportunity to have a virtual tour of the school by the Head of House, followed by a Q&A session led by the Tutor. There will also be an opportunity for some Tutor group icebreaker activities and a quiz.

Students will remain in the room for the duration of the morning session.

Equipment There is no need for students to bring a great deal with them when they attend school. We would advise a snack, water bottle and pencil case. Anything else required will be provided. Students should not borrow or lend resources during these sessions.

Toilets If students need to use the facilities when in school they will need to ask the teacher in the normal way. No more than 2 students are permitted to use the facilities at the same time. There will be an allocated toilet for students to use, which will be cleaned regularly. Students should wash their hands thoroughly after using the facilities, and use the hand sanitiser on re-entering the classroom.

Leaving The school day ends at 11.00am. Students will be dismissed from their room a group at a time by a member of the Senior Leadership Team, and directed back to the tennis courts for collection of students by parents by 11.00am. When collecting students in the car park we would ask that drivers should try to leave a one space gap between cars where possible.
